

PET EMERGENCY DISASTER KIT

BEFORE - DURING - AFTER

BEFORE

- Prepare a Pet Emergency Kit with essential items before an emergency.
- Store vital documents in a watertight container, including pet registration, vaccination records
- Pack 3 to 7 days' worth of pet food and fresh water, using airtight containers for dry food.
- Create an emergency contact list with pet owner and caregiver details, as well as your pet's veterinary information.
- Prepare a Pet Information Sheet with detailed descriptions and photos of your pets, and consider microchipping for added safety.
- Identify pet-friendly shelters, boarding facilities, or hotels in your area or evacuation route.
- Practice getting your pets accustomed to being in their carriers or crates to reduce stress during evacuation.

DURING

- Stay informed by monitoring local news, weather reports, and emergency alerts.
- Follow evacuation orders and instructions from local authorities to prioritize your pets' safety.
- During evacuation, move quickly but calmly and secure your pets in carriers or on leashes. Watch for any hazards in their path, such as broken glass.
- Take your Pet Emergency Kit with you during evacuation and ensure your pets wear their ID tags.
- Comfort your pets during emergencies with reassurance, comforting items, and their favorite toys, and maintain their routine to reduce stress.

AFTER

- Prioritize pet safety by ensuring your home is safe before bringing them back after an emergency.
- Check for hazards like loose wires, broken glass, or contaminated water in your environment.
- If your pet got separated during the emergency, contact local shelters and animal control to search for lost pets.
- Update your pet's microchip information if needed to improve identification.
- After returning home, consult a veterinarian for a health check to ensure your pet's well-being.
- Assess and restock your Pet Emergency Kit by replacing expired or used items, including food, water, and medications, to prepare for future emergencies.

DOCUMENTS

Store documents in a watertight container

- ☐ Pet registrations / Adoption records
- ☐ Vaccination records
- ☐ Rabies certificates
- ☐ Vet/Medical history
- ☐ Medication prescriptions
- ☐ Microchip information
- ☐ Emergency contact List
- ☐ Pet description with recent photo

FOOD, WATER, AND MEDICATIONS:

Store dry food and medications in watertight containers

- ☐ 3-7 days worth of food & water for each pet
- ☐ Opt for canned food (longer shelf life)
- ☐ Food and water bowls
- ☐ Manual can opener
- ☐ Any specific feeding instructions
- ☐ Medication with instructions
- ☐ 1-month's worth of flea, tick, heartworm preventative

ADDITIONAL ITEMS:

- ☐ Collar or harness with ID
- ☐ Leash
- ☐ Appropriate-sized pet carrier
- ☐ Comfort items: toys, bedding, blankets or towels
- ☐ Cleaning Supplies: paper towels, plastic bags, disinfectant
- ☐ Litter box & litters for cats
- ☐ First aid kit with pet safe products
